- Neil called and rang 5-6 to the difficult turning courses of Plain Bob Major at the heart of the easy quarter peal composition.

We need to consolidate the achievements with some Quarter peals over the summer and then make some more strides in the autumn.

The following day saw a gathering in Kirk Ella for a Quarter of Plain Bob Royal, *Barry Peachey's* first Royal in hand, and *Heather Peachey's* first Royal in hand for 14 years.

The following week (16th) we had neither *Chris Munday* nor *Neil Turner*, so we were restricted to Plain Bob Major (culminating in a ladies band course of Plain Bob Major), a solid set of courses and a touch of Kent TB Minor, a strange 180 of Plain Bob Minor, and an excursion into the realms of St Clement's College Bob Minor.

And in the absence of Neil Turner, the Wednesday group met and rang a quarter of Plain Bob Minor in Melbourne, *Karen Lane conducting*. *Well done Karen!*
