Damien Garwood continues to make solid progress; the first online session this month (Wednesday 3rd) included 720 Kent TB Minor. By the end of the month Damien had rung quarter peals of both Kent TB and Oxford TB on 1-2, and was exploring how to ring inside pairs to Treble Bob by following the position of the treble by ear (Damien is registered blind).

Damien has benefitted from the experience of teaching Rebecca Legowski (also blind).

Their ringing achievements are theirs alone, they are the ones that have persisted through the struggles, until the method becomes clear enough to ring, they are the ones that spend long lonely hours with only the sound of Abel for company. But they have also mastered methods, and ring to perfect rhythm, the last quarter peal had zero trips.

They also owe a debt of gratitude to Heather Peachey and Graham Nabb both passionately keen on teaching how to teach ringing. Both were consulted before we started teaching Rebecca, and if either had cautioned against teaching a blind person these two handbell stars would have been extinguished without a sound.




