The Learning Curve

The (Great Glen) Scottish ringers have focused on moving from Kent Treble Bob to Hitcham Delight. Kent to Hitcham is a bit like St Clement's to Buxton; and I have trouble with the 1236.

For me, a better stepping stone method would be Wath Delight which can be rung as a rule extension of Kent: Ring Kent TB Minor except that when the treble hunts through 4-5, lies behind, and hunts 5-4 when 3rds place is made and the bells in 1-2 dodge.

Why do I prefer this?

Because I can use the treble more easily as a guide:

When treble's dodging in 3-4 or 5-6 the method is pure Kent, X 12 X

When treble's hunting above 2nds, 3rds place is made and the bells in 1-2 dodge.

For comparison:

Kent TB	34X34.16 x12x 16	x12x 16 x12x	16	x12x 16.34x34. 16
Wath D	34X34.16 x12x 36	x12x 36 x12x	36	x12x 16.34x34. 16
Hitcham D	34X34.16 x12x 1236	x12x 36 x12x	1236	x12x 16.34x34. 16

And the good news: Both Wath and Hitcham preserve the coursing order in the same manner as St Clement's; the bells go onto the front in c.o., and then the following bells each make 3rds in turn in coursing order sequence.

Other Kent related stuff to look at:

Writtle: Kent Places everywhere

Staybenders: Kent places absolutely everywhere but not like those you got in Writtle

Barrow: Kent places with the treble

Pontefract: 2nds place Wath Alderbourne: 2nds place Hitcham

Getafix: Bob course of Hitcham or Aldebourne

Irregular

March: Wath: move the 1-2 places to 3-4 and have fun with the 5-pull dodge in 1-2

King Stephen: 2nds place March
