## Out and about

The Learning Curve.
"I can't learn coursing orders".
That was the reply I got from a well-respected local ringing teacher when I suggested that it was easier to learn coursing orders than transpose them on the fly whilst ringing a pair of bells, and remembering the composition.

Well, if a composition is merely a table of symbols, and coursing orders nothing but a string of numbers, then yes I agree, normal use of one's memory is inadequate.

Memory becomes powerful if the thing to be
remembered has context and meaning so that memory has something to work with. Some form of association, kinaesthetic memory uses many of or senses simultaneously.

The person that told me they couldn't learn coursing orders, went on to tell me that you can call the Home-Wrong of Wrong-HomeWrong because those two consecutive calls follow the lead in which 5 and 6 dodge together in 3-4. 6 goes on from there to dodge 5-6 Down (the Home) and 5-6 Up (The Wrong) whilst 5 runs out twice.

Precisely my point, the work of 5-6 gives a context to the changes in coursing order because the composition is something you are totally involved with.

From the Plain Course ringing 5-6:
5... 6 Bob Wrong ..5.64ths \& 5-6 Up
..5.6 Bob Home . 5 . . 6 Run Out \& 5-6 Dn
. 5 . . 6 Bob Wrong 5 . . 6 Run Out \& 5-6 Up
Easy Peasey!
Oh, yes, what about the 3 other bells?
I will write that up for the website and send a link next month. In the meantime, start with 5-6, learn where they are in the coursing order structure and how they fit together every lead end. Don't worry about 2,3 , and 4 to begin with, get yourself a nice firm coursing order structure, a foundation stone to build upon.
