The first meeting in the month benefitted greatly from having **Chris Munday** and his bells. We rang in two rooms and **Chris** inspired several people to ring at a new level which included splicing Plain Bob and Little Bob.

It also afforded **Chris Church** a valuable opportunity to ring Kent Treble Bob on 3-4. Numerous "firsts" were achieved and these have been added to the Ringing Master's list.

With the objective of ringing a Date Touch of 2018 Minor for Remembrance Day we have had a focus on Little Bob. The date touch was duly rung in fine style and the following Tuesday we rang a normal length Quarter Peal but included much more of Little Bob to prove that we could ring the method.

The last two "Older but no wiser" sessions had fewer ringers but were very valuable in giving extra hands-on-bells time for those who were there.

A short "pipe-cleaner" of Plain Bob Minor was followed by an exploration of S Clement's College Bob Minor, the pairs proving quite tricky.

But not as tricky as Single Court rung by watching the treble. This was rung without learning the lines, without simulator practice, just putting the elements of Plain Bob together in a different order.

The key skill in here is ringing Plain Hunting on autopilot so that the "control centre" can watch where the treble is and hence call up the structure of the method.

### Market Weighton

The quarter peal with **Karen Lane** on 17th November had a clear purpose of showing her how to make life easier as a conductor on handbells.

We coupled that with some work on Kent TB and Forward Minor.

### **Statistics**

10th February 2017 saw the first quarter peal for the project and 20<sup>th</sup> November had the 50<sup>th</sup>. Approximately one every 13 days.

Nine handbell quarters recorded this month for B&D, exceeding the previous record of 8 rung in May 1974.

Peter Church reached 200 quarters on handbells and 250 as conductor. Barking Little Bob Minor springs to mind.

#### The Learning Curve

Yours truly has made some impressive changes to his sleeping patterns. You have in the past received e-mails from me at random times of the day and night, 3:30 (am) was no stranger to me. Not any longer, I have read Matthew Walker's new book, "Why We Sleep" and implemented some of his suggestions. I mention this for two reasons:

Sleep is so fundamental to good physical and mental health that I would recommend that everyone reads the book whether or not they are an insomniac.

The science of sleep is now beginning to address the learning process, and it seems that the "sorting and filing" of memories is not a one-shot process, it can take 3 or 4 sleeps before information is finally embedded in the neuron structures of the brain.

Neurons that fire together, wire together. My brain now associates the first 6 changes of the Stedman slow work with the word "Monday". It took a lot of repetition and "sleeping on it" before I finally got that, together with the rest of the Stedman week.

So if you're struggling to learn a method, don't leave it until the last minute before practice to do your revision. If you don't really <u>know it</u> you won't be able to ring it, that's for sure.

Start memorising on Wednesday for ringing something new the following Tuesday. Looking at a method during practice sessions is pretty useless, you need to look at it every day until the next session. Then you can sleep on it several times knowing you will be OK on practice night.
